### About the Department

The birth of Analytical and Applied Economics department took place in the name of Department of Rural Economics and Sociology in the year 1956 with an initial grant from the Ford Foundation. The Post Graduate teaching in Applied Economics was introduced in the department in 1963 and in 1974 the name of the department was changed into the Department of Analytical and Applied Economics.

In recognition of the significant contributions made by this department in the field of economics research, the UGC selected the department as a Centre for Teacher-Fellowship Program in Economics in the year 1977, as a Department of Special Assistance (DSA) in the year 1989 and Centre of Advanced Study (CAS) in 2010-11. The Department has also been recognized by the UGC under the ASIHSS program for a period of five years starting from 2006-07 to 2011-12. The academic and research contribution of the department was also recognized by the SBI and it instituted a Chair in Rural Economics in 1981, by creating an Endowment of ₹6 lakh and it functioned till 2000. The RBI also instituted a Chair in Institutional Finance in 1982 which is now functioning.

The department now offers MA, M. Phil, and PhD courses in Analytical and Applied Economics. The faculty members of the department have won several national and international fellowships, awards and other grants from time to time. Almost every year, the department has organized various regional and national Seminars and workshops. The department brings out a journal entitled "Utkal Economic Papers" (ISSN 0976 – 7592) to promote the publication of original research works carried out by the faculty members of the department and several affiliated colleges in Orissa.

### Background of the Conference

The population of the world is expected to touch nine billion by 2050, and they will all need food, water, and energy. The present growth patterns are highly inefficient. To manage this inefficient scenario, inclusive green growth is the panacea.

In this planet (i) 13 million hectares of forest is lost annually between 2000 and 2010, an area which is approximately equal to the size of Nicaragua; (ii) the water withdrawals has increased to an extent in the last 50 years which is likely to lead to water scarcity; (iii) 550 billion tons of CO<sub>2</sub> is emitted globally from 1990 to 2010 (iii) 85 per cent of ocean fisheries has been fully exploited, or over-exploited, or depleted; (iv) \$1 trillion is spent annually to subsidize over-exploitation of natural capital, including fossil fuels (v) 2.6 billion people do not have access to sanitation (vi) 1.3 billion people are without electricity and (vii) 900 million people are without safe

and clean drinking water. The way forward is inclusive green growth that is clean in its treatment of the environment, efficient in its use of natural resources, resilient, and meets the needs of all people (World Bank).

Inclusive Green Growth could be defined as the growth which improves the welfare of current and future generation (Albagoury, 2016). It acknowledges the role of natural capital in growth (Bouma and Berkhout 2015). IMF defines Inclusive Green Growth as "a paradigm that aims to achieve sustainable development by reconciling developing countries' urgent need for rapid growth and poverty alleviation with the need to avoid irreversible and costly environmental damage." So Inclusive Green Growth could be seen as the way to achieve sustainable development (Albagoury 2016). Inclusive green growth can also be defined as development that creates synergies among the three aspects of sustainability such as social, economic and environmental (Albagoury 2016).

It also offers an alternative for tackling the unique development challenges of the region, including persistent poverty and unemployment, environmental degradation, vulnerability to climate change and rapid population growth (United Nations Economic Commission for Africa, 2016). It is not a new paradigm. Rather, it aims to operationalize sustainable development by reconciling developing countries' urgent need for rapid growth and poverty alleviation with the need to avoid irreversible and costly environmental damage (Fay 2012). It is necessary, efficient, and affordable. It is necessary because sustainable development cannot be achieved without it. It is efficient in that addressing the market and governance failures that plague our economic systems will create plenty of scope for growing cleaner without necessarily growing slower (Fay 2012).
